One of the key ways we give back to the College is through our Class of 1985 support of “Class Projects.” **Thank you for paying your class dues each year** and helping to fund these projects.

The Class of 1985 has elected to use the our “class projects” funds to provide support to Dartmouth students who accept unpaid internships through the Center for Professional Development (CPD) and the Center for Service / Dartmouth Partners in Community Service (DPCS). Dartmouth Partners in Community Service (DPCS) provides funding up to \$5000 for domestic community service internships with non-profit agencies. This alumni-supported program was started by the class of 1959 more than 20 years ago, and it now enjoys the sponsorship of nearly 20 alumni classes. The Class of 1985 is proud to be among them. Funded interns are matched with Dartmouth alumni, who serve as mentors throughout the internship experience.

DPCS internships reached an all-time high in 2016-2017, with 42 interns mentored by 42 alumni from 16 different classes - and applications for these internship opportunities have soared to more than 100 for the year.

2017-2018 is on track to be another strong year, beginning with a record number of 36 interns this summer who will participate in summer “cohort” programs in Boston and San Francisco (“cohort” programs offer the opportunity for interns to all stay together in one dorm and to enjoy special programming as a supplement to their internship experience).

We, the Dartmouth Class of 1985 — as “class sponsors” of DPCS — have a range of opportunities available to us to continue to provide support and to expand our level of commitment:

- we can volunteer to serve as mentors to students interning in social impact organizations
- we can support summer “cohort” groups in Boston and San Francisco in a variety of ways
- and we can offer career advice to students and recent grads interested in careers in the social sector.


